If you are looking for a way to include you children in a mission project.....HERE IT IS. Every year, DUMC works with King George Social Services to provide the ingredients for a complete Thanksgiving dinner to be donated to families in need across the county. The Short family donates the boxes and a list of suggested food items are made available. DUMC graciously offers upwards of 10+ meals to this ministry. If you have young children this is an excellent way to include them in helping shop for other's needs.

Boxes can contain whatever you feel belongs with a holiday dinner: turkey or ham, potatoes, canned gravy, yams, stuffing, cranberries, canned green beans/corn, rolls/butter, pies and more. Also consider food that could be added to make more meals from the leftovers, such as rice, chicken broth, noodles.

NOTE: TURKEYS SHOULD BE FROZEN BUT NO FROZEN DESSERTS.

Filled boxes, with assigned #'s are to be delivered to Oakland Baptist Church parking lot on Tuesday, 25 November, between the time of 8 a.m-11:00 a.m. Please consider sharing a meal with another family in King George.

Church Facebook Page

Atrium Monitor Slideshow

Our Call to Serve and the Kingdom of God

Many of you reading this article have answered God's call to serve, and maybe He's nudging you to continue that service and expand into other areas of service, too (I hope that's the case), but how does this relate to the Kingdom of God? When we look at how Jesus spoke of God's Kingdom, it's clear that we are participants in His Kingdom here on earth, right now. As Missions Team chair, and VBS Director, I'm always interested in recruiting people to help out with VBS in the summer and with our various Missions projects, such as From the Heart, Valor Ranch,

Love Thy Neighbor, the Agape Christian Children's Center, Tending the Flock, and support of the food pantry on the base. Lending a hand at our various church events, such as Trunk-or-Treat or Believe in Jesus, is a great way to shine the light of Christ to others, as well. Our purpose in serving others is to glorify God, and to further His Kingdom, one heart at a time. It's impossible to fully predict how your service will impact the people you serve, and also the people who observe your actions.

One of the things Jesus compared the Kingdom of God to was a mustard seed: (Mark 4:30-34) Again he said, "What shall we say the Kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest seed you plant in the ground. Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds of the air can perch in its shade." What Jesus meant by using this analogy to a mustard seed is that over time, small things add up to something much bigger than the individual parts, so we should take every opportunity we can to do good and trust that each of these acts furthers God's Kingdom here on earth. In this season of thankfulness and giving, please consider expanding how you serve. I urge you to follow the nudges of the Holy Spirit, despite the fact that they are easy to push aside and difficult to say "yes" to. Remember, these nudges are ultimately a fulfillment of God's will for you and His people. Have a fruitful and blessed Thanksgiving!
